Creating a butterfly garden is a rewarding and exciting experience. Butterfly gardening is important to butterfly species as their habitats continue to be reduced. You can help by planting the right plants. Pick and choose what plants to use for your style of gardening. You can have a pristine, manicured look or more of a wild look or anything in between. Just be sure to select a sunny, sheltered location. Plant larval plants as well as nectar plants. It is critical that you refrain from using pesticides. Plant native plants whenever you can—natives will do best and require less maintenance once established. If you plant non-natives be sure you select plants that are not invasive.
