- ❑ **NABA Butterfly Center** on 100 acres of land fronting the Rio Grande River in Mission, Texas is celebrating five years of growth! NABA Butterfly Center provides an important link in the wildlife corridor along the Rio Grande Valley that is being created by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service. The Lower Rio Grande Valley contains the most diverse butterfly fauna in the United States and is also one of the most endangered ecosystems in the United States. Your donation will help to preserve both butterflies and an endangered ecosystem.
- ❑ **NABA Miami Blue Fund** supports efforts to conserve the special butterfly fauna of southern Florida and the Keys, constituting perhaps the largest suite of threatened and endangered butterflies in the U.S. These include Miami Blue, Schaus' Swallowtail, Florida Leafwing, Bartram's Scrub-Hairstreak, Florida Purplewing, and Zestos Skipper, among others. Miami Blues were recently listed as endangered by the State of Florida due to NABA's efforts and this has resulted in the initiation of a conservation program for the species.
